Dear fellow doctoral students,

The Doctoral Students Convention (DSC) was formed in November 2015 as a forum and representation of all doctoral students at the Heidelberg University. The main purpose of the Convention is to advise and inform the faculties and the University administration in matters related to doctoral regulations. We exercise this role through our advisory (guest) seat in the senate of the University, as well as our four seats in the Council for Graduate Studies.

The Convention consists of all doctoral students at Heidelberg University and therefore we would like to encourage you to actively participate. The Convention is a great platform for interacting with the University administration in an unified fashion. For larger projects or more specialized issues, we establish working groups every doctoral student is encouraged to participate in. Examples are: working groups like »Survey – Needs and Wants«, or »International Doctoral Students«. Working groups can address any specific problem concerning doctoral students in general or faculty specific problems. Furthermore, the Convention gives doctoral students the opportunity to interact with other doctoral students from other faculties. We are very much looking forward to your participation and suggestions!

OUR MISSION

- Representation in all University councils, including faculty councils
- Equally represent all doctoral students, irrespective of their field of study or type of study
- Fostering of inter faculty collaboration and exchange
- Establishing doctoral students as a status group

STRUCTURE

The Convention is split in four main parts: General Assembly, Regular Meetings, Executive Committee, and working groups.

The General Assembly

At the General Assembly, the executive committee of the DSC reports and discusses on important topics. In addition, the executive committee is elected for the next one year period. The General Assembly is the main legal platform of the convention.

The executive committee consists of eight representatives equally elected from the following four fields of study: Humanities, Life Sciences, Natural Sciences and Social Sciences. As well as an additional three members who represent the following types of study: individual doctorates, academic employees and doctorates within a graduate school. Each registered doctoral student has the right to vote.

Regular Meetings

Every semester the executive committee organises meetings for all doctoral students. During these meetings we will update you on progress, form working groups and raise important topics concerning the DSC. The time of these meetings will be communicated via our newsletter. Feel free to suggest agenda items and we welcome active participation across all topics.
